Caddie Scholarship Opportunities:

Edgewood supports caddies in many ways. We support the Western Golf Associations Evan's Scholarship Foundation and have our own internally funded Paul VanLoozen Scholarship Program. Both help good caddies further their education.



Evans Scholarship: This program is the nation's largest scholarship program funded by private gifts and is devoted entirely to providing college education to deserving caddies. Edgewood has sponsored 6 Evans Scholars. All have received a full scholarship to their school of choice.

Paul VanLoozen Scholarship Program: For years Edgewood has successfully operated this program for the benefit our caddies and our membership. Eligible caddies may receive up to \$1,000 per semester for tuition and expenses at college.

2017-18 Program Overview







The Evans Scholars Foundation awards full tuition and housing scholarships to high-achieving caddies with limited financial means. Established in 1930 by the Western Golf Association and celebrated amateur golfer Charles "Chick" Evans Jr., the Foundation administers the nation's largest scholarship program for caddies. Currently, 965 students are enrolled at 19 universities, including 14 where the Evans Scholars Foundation operates Scholarship Houses. More than 10,600 men and women have graduated as Evans Scholars.

With tuition rates on the rise, paying for college has become increasingly difficult for many families. In recent years, record numbers of caddies have applied for the Evans Scholarship, showing that the need is greater than ever. To meet these challenges, the Foundation plans to grow the number of Scholars living in community to 1,000 by 2020, while expanding the Program geographically from coast to coast. Today, more than 30,600 Par Club donors support the Evans Scholars Foundation. The Foundation is also the sole beneficiary of the BMW Championship, a PGA TOUR FedExCup Playoff event conducted by the Western Golf Association. To learn more, please visit www.wgaesf.org.
